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JUSTIFICATION

The changes to the educational and professional program are due to the need to clarify the content of the educational and professional program 231.00.01 Social work, approved by the decision of the Academic Council of the Borys Grinchenko Kyiv University dated April 25, 2019, protocol No. 4 (order No. 295 dated April 25, 2019) taking into account the order of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine No. 557 dated 24.04.2019 on the approval of the standard of higher education in the specialty 231 "Social work" for the first (bachelor's) level of higher education, the main provisions of the Law of Ukraine "On Social Services", State Standards of Provision social services.

During the implementation of the educational and professional program, in particular, the implementation of the curriculum, the development of programs of educational disciplines, practical training, certification, surveys during the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023 academic years, the support group received feedback from teaching staff, applicants, managers of practice bases, employers, graduates with a number of wishes regarding the optimization of individual components of the educational and professional program. The need for mastering new knowledge, skills, and technologies was revealed during the analysis of the international and Ukrainian experience of training specialists in the social sphere; the request of graduates; modern trends in the development of specialty 231 Social work, the needs of the labor market and the peculiarities of the provision of social services in connection with the COVID-19 pandemic and martial law in the country.

Therefore, in accordance with the Standard of Higher Education in the specialty 231 Social work for the first (bachelor) level of higher education, as well as taking into account the feedback of stakeholders, agreeing on changes and clarifications to the educational and professional program, the following changes were developed and introduced:

- the purpose of the educational and professional program, its characteristics, the suitability of graduates for employment and further education have been specified;
- new special (professional) competences and program learning outcomes were clarified and introduced;
- educational components aimed at the study of modern trends in the development of the specialty and the specifics of the provision of social services and the implementation of social work with recipients of social services (vulnerable, excluded and discriminatory groups) have been introduced into the compulsory part;
- the list of components of the educational and professional program and their logical sequence;
- the optional block has been updated.

The specified changes led to the development of a new edition of the description of the educational and professional program.

Qualification work involves the independent solution of a complex task or a complex problem in the field of social work, which is accompanied by research and/or the use of innovative approaches and is characterized by the uncertainty of conditions and requirements.

The qualifying work is checked for plagiarism. The qualifying work must not contain academic plagiarism, fabrication and/or falsification.

The qualification work is published on the University website (in the repository).

Completion of the educational and professional program in its entirety is completed by issuing the graduate a document of the prescribed format.

The choice of block 1 by the applicant creates conditions for deepening professional competences within the chosen educational and professional program.

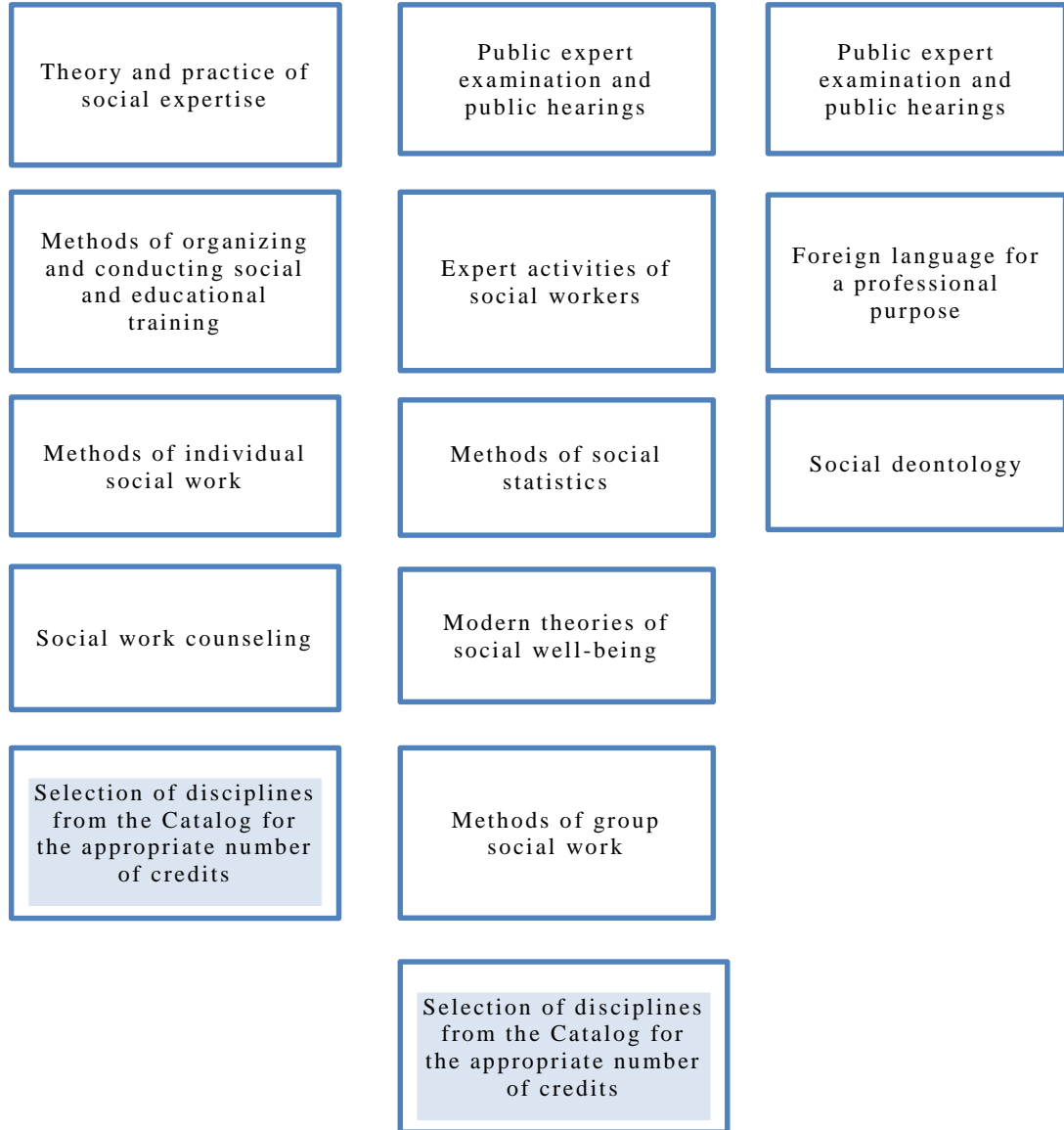
